The lights dimmed in Harlawhill



It is with great sadness that we announce the untimely passing of our beloved Chairperson Jean Thomson BEM on Monday 8th March.

Jean was, and will always be remembered as, the cornerstone of the Harlawhill family, having served on the steering group to create it and then selflessly giving her time freely to the Day Centre for another 30 years as a volunteer and trustee.

Born in Prestonpans in 1940, Jean was a true force of nature who cared deeply for her community as a speech therapist, a keen member of the drama group, the Stroke Club and Prestongrange Church. A great speaker with many stories to tell and a much sought after Burns Supper participant.

(Editor: - Having been coerced into delivering the “Address to the Lassies” at a Burn’s Supper, I asked Jean to look over my speech as she was a world renown expert on all things Burns. All good, I deliver my speech and sat down feeling pleased with myself. Then who stood up but Jean to do her “Reply to the Laddies”. Knowing full well what I had prepared, Jean then proceeded to put me in my place – all with a smile on her face)

Jean will of course be fondly remembered by many for her work with Harlawhill Day Centre where she positively affected the lives of so many people through the charitable contributions of her time, donations, and the determination she showed in making the Day Centre what it is today.

Jean would attend twice a week and spend time working with clients on their life stories. A natural people person who could empathise with everyone she met, putting them at ease in her company. Her life story work, particularly those suffering from Alzheimer’s and Dementia, was so special and of great comfort to both them and their families.

Jean's times in the Day Centre always brought a smile to everyone's face and she brightened up every room she entered. A woman who led by example and an inspiration to all who were lucky enough to be in her company and those privileged enough to call her a friend.

Always one to shun the limelight or recognition, she was awarded the BEM (British Empire Medal) in the Queen's New Year's Honour's last year but sadly, due to Covid, the celebration she deserved could not be organised along with her 80th birthday celebrations. When restrictions permit, we hope to organise a celebration of Jean's life and achievements in recognition of her contributions to Harlawhill and the wider community. Thank you, Jean, for showing us the way, you will be forever in our hearts and we are comforted by sharing so many memories of our times spent together.

Our condolences, love, thoughts, and prayers are with Jean's family at this difficult time.

Building News

Sadly, for us to reopen safely, our risk assessments have flagged up a ventilation issue. This means that we need windows that can open to keep the Day Centre well ventilated as none of our present windows open. After long discussions with East Lothian Council, as always money was the issue. Fiona O'Donnell, our local councillor has managed to secure us £5,000 to replace the windows in the main lounge area. We still needed £10,000 to fund the other windows at the front of the building.

A great supporter of our Day Centre, the lovely Tom Jardine (90 years young) was most upset upon hearing that our Day Centre could not open due to the window problems. When Tom told his son of the ongoing issues at Harlawhill, he used his contacts in the wider community to see what could be done. The result of which is that we have managed to secure the funding of the full amount needed from the "Walk with Scott Foundation". The late Scott Glynn was another great support of our Day Centre and he would be so proud to hear his charity is helping our Day Centre get reopened. Tom Jardine himself also donated £1,000 to our Day Centre to help with these costs and in the memory of Jean Thomson so a MASSIVE thank you to Tom Jardine and the "Walk with Scott Foundation"what a great community we live in.

Trustees

We welcome Ewan McMillan on board as a new trustee. Ewan is well known in our Day Centre having been a volunteer these past 3-4 years. Ewan has great energy and good ideas (he has recently set up our amazing new website <https://harlawhilldcc.co.uk>) so he will help us strive to keep the excellent Day Centre we have.

Another two trustees, Fiona Stewart, and Morag Dickson both work hard behind the scenes in applying and securing funding for our centre. They have recently secured funding from the Lottery Scheme to allow us to purchase a new electronic front door (keeping everyone safe) and continuing funding for all the equipment required to allow us to open.

We recently received just over £1,000 from the Co-op as a chosen charity for the Blue Card Cash Back Scheme so that is another great donation. We will be looking at using this to get new window blinds to go with our new windows.....yippee!!

We will have strict guidelines to follow but we will make sure you are safe and still manage to enjoy your day with a nice meal, guid company and we will still find ways for fun and laughter.

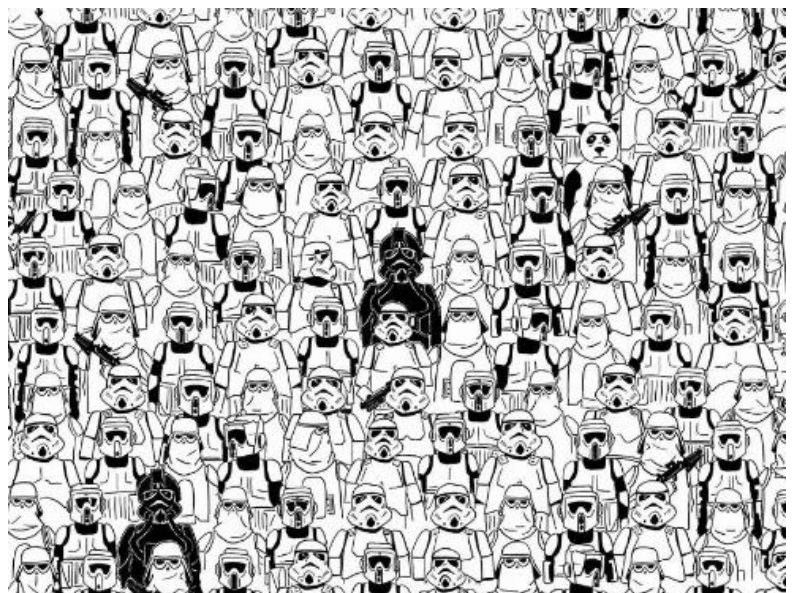
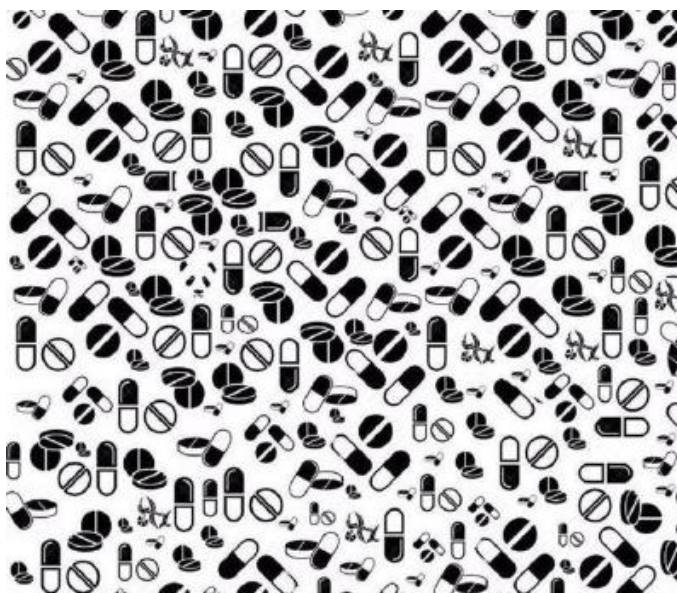

Take care everyone, and remember, if you have any questions or queries, we are always at the end of the phone to support however we can.

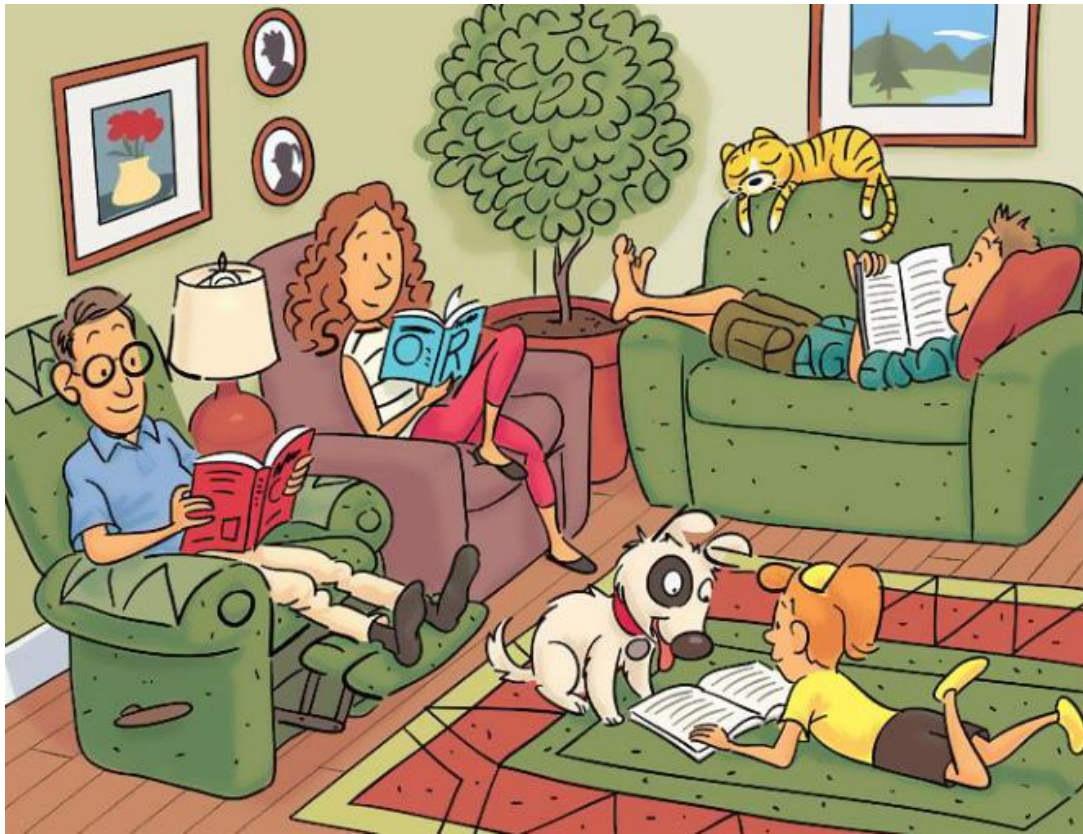
